Advise from our State Advocate

Today the Clerk of the House read a memo to all Representatives warning of some rather vile letters being sent to select members of the General Court. While I did make the "Most Radical" list on a site recently removed after it was crashed multiple times by Pro-Life conservatives, I have not yet been privileged with being derogatorily called a person with far more eumelanin than have I. Vile language indeed, but I am remembering a verse about having one's beard plucked from the Gospels.

That aside. I came across a very partisan article regarding the treatment of a family group prayerfully, nonviolently, respectfully hold vigil at an abortinary. For those that care, the place where babies are killed is not, to me, a health clinic any more than are the planned "end of life treatment centers" are holistic medicine. You may recall a now failing news outlet once famously described the burning of Portland, OR (I believe) was a mostly peaceful protest. There is a link to the article below.

Please remember the Daily Signal is partisan, so just skip over the "anti" (political personage) BS and focus on the underlying issue. There is a federal law that prevents blockading or harassing or interfering (or apparently engaging in prayerful protest) around abortinaries. The family was arrested at gun point at their home in a raid sometime after the protest. Yes, arrested at gun point in front of their family, minor children and neighbors for exercising the First Amendment Rights of both Religious Expression (the practice thereof) and of Speech. Diocletian would be proud was one of the first thoughts I had upon reading this article. In China, Russia, Myanmar, Saudi Arabia, Iran, Syria, Yemen, Australia, Canada and the United Kingdom people have been arrested for exercising their religious and speech rights, but in the USA?

Thus, the question arises; why post this article in a K of C venue? I am not advocating for this or that candidate. I am not saying this or that party is the only one that has value. I am known in Concord to hold strong views and being capable of defending those views with facts. I have also co-sponsored some significant legislation with persons not registered in the same party as am I; I recently defended two Hillsborough County Democrats from intra-party verbal and, in one case, near physical abuse.

I am warning that standing for a cause, even a cause as great as Holy Mother Church, pro-life issue, or conformity to our Constitution, may have consequences. That does not mean avoiding the issues, that merely means be aware. Conduct yourself with dignity and respect for others. Go out of your way to avoid confrontation, break no laws (I could say peacefully and patriotically, but that may not unfortunately be a good

phrase to use any more); HOWEVER, put on the armor of God and make your voices heard. While you are at it make sure someone, not in the demonstration, is legally recording (voice recordings are illegal in NH except where allowed by law (RSA 570A)) your actions for use in defense if something untoward happens. In the words of the Watch Sergeant on Hill Street Blues "Let's be safe out there!"

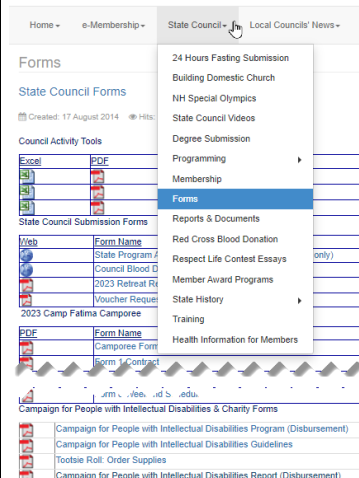

According to a new peer-reviewed study from the Charlotte Lozier Institute, nearly 70% of abortions are coerced, unwanted, or inconsistent with women's preferences (43% of post-abortive mothers reported that their abortions were inconsistent with their values and preferences). Panic, fear, pressure, coercion...are these really "choices"? This is why we need to be "out there" in the public, especially at abortion sites, to offer those facing unplanned pregnancies an "out", a path of hope to counter the panic, fear, coercion they're facing. Most don't really want the abortion--they're looking for a reason to not go through with it--your presence and prayers can be the ray of hope they need.

The annual March for Life in Concord last Saturday had about 300 people (by my guess). The theme was "Empowering Pregnant Women to Keep Their Babies." That's what you're doing by being present on the sidewalk--empowering them to make the right choice. As the study above shows, most women are looking for a lifeline, a glimmer of hope and support, to persuade them to keep their babies. Seeing you there may just be what they need to have that change of heart to reconsider what they're about to do.

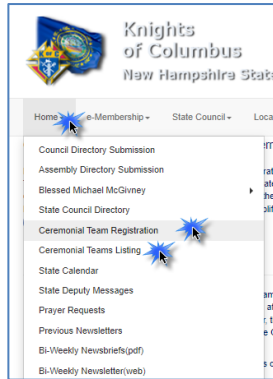

Penny A Knight A Day Program (PKD)

December 13, 2023

To: Worthy District Deputies, Worthy Grand Knights, Worthy Financial Secretaries:

Vocations to the priesthood and religious life are very important to the Catholic Church and to our Order. We need priests to offer the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and to teach and lead us on the path to Jesus. Education costs are extremely high for the candidates to the priesthood and religious life. The NH State Council wants to assist these men and women with a special calling by providing financial support for their education.

The **Penny-A-Knight-A-Day (PKD)** program was established by the NH State Council at the October 2009 Quarterly Meeting. This program is **voluntary** and provides needed dollars to the NH State Council Vocations fund. This fund is used to support religious vocations to qualified candidates throughout the State of NH.

On an annual basis, the PKD program asks each Brother Knight to add an additional \$3.65 (Penny-A- Knight-A-Day) to their annual council dues. The entire \$3.65 would be deposited into the NH State Council Vocations fund and used for priests and religious.

The process is as follows:

- Council Financial Secretary (FS) sends out the annual dues statements to the members.
 - An additional note is added to the billing statement using in Member Management System (or separate insert - see page 3) asking the member to add PKD - \$3.65 (.01 per day X 365) to their annual dues for the NH State Council Vocations Fund **NOTE:** Keep in mind this is a **voluntary** program.
- FS collects the additional \$3.65 and maintains separate documentation to track the PKD funds collected.
- The FS prepares a Report of Vouchers entry for all PKD donations from the Council to the Council Treasurer who in turn will write one check payable to the "NH State Council", **annotating in the "Memo" line "Vocations Fund."**
- Treasurer mails the check to the State Council Secretary before the State Convention.
- The State Deputy will present a check representing the combined donations of all NH State Councils to the Bishop of Manchester at the State Convention.
- A check in the amount of **\$3,355.75** was presented to our Bishop at the April 2023 Convention.

I want to emphasize again that this is a **voluntary** program. However, because of the shortage of priests and religious, it is imperative that we as Knights of Columbus do all we can to promote religious vocations throughout the world and especially in the State of New Hampshire. Please bring this proposal to the membership at your very next Council Business meeting.

The candidates for the priesthood and religious life will be most grateful to the Order for our donations to assist them in completing their theological studies.
