I want to thank everyone who participated in the McGivney 2020 Rosary Program and help far exceed our goal of 2020 Rosaries by Founder's Day, March29. As of the writing of this report we have recorded 4,147 ROSARIES or 205% of our goal and still going. I ask you to invite your families and parishioners to continue to participate throughout the year. "WELL DONE, MY GOOD AND FAITHFUL SERVNAT(S)". I want to thank everyone who joined us online for The Blessed Michael McGivney Prayer Hour for his canonization which was opened to all your parishes.

I was saddened when we again could not have our Traveling Icon Program. Once our number restrictions on gathering in church are lifted, we will again begin the program with the icon of St. Michael The Archangel. I pray it will be as successful as the Icon of Our Lady Of Persecuted Christians was, with FOUR THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED SEVENTY- NINE parishioners participating in this program.

LEAVE NO NEIGHBOOR BEHIND became our mantra with COVID sweeping the world. Many of your Councils swung into action with food drives – 40 Cans For Lent. You helped deliver meals to the homebound and continued to sponsor blood drives. You called and knocked on doors of Brother Knights and neighbors to see if they needed anything. Due to COIVD we were unable to hold our Annual Men's Retreat. The good news is the retreat is scheduled for September 17th – 19th at Camp Bernadette on the beautiful shores of Lake Wentworth, Wolfeboro, NH. As always, our chef John McClure and his staff will provide us with a bounty of food, along with our Saturday Surf and Turf, that would equal a five-star restaurant. We all need our spiritual batteries rechanged so please save the date, September 17th - 19th for this year's retreat.

I want to thank all the Councils and State Vocations Chairman, PSD Ed Mele who continue to support our men and women in formation through RSVP and the Christmas Gift Card Program. Many of us have read their thank you cards as they are so appreciative of our support. We need more vocations. We need to be out there talking to young boys and girls of our parishes about the religious life. The ideal ones to talk to are our altar servers. A recent survey of newly ordained priests indicated 75% served as an altar server and more 53% participated in a parish youth group. Please continue to pray for vocations.
